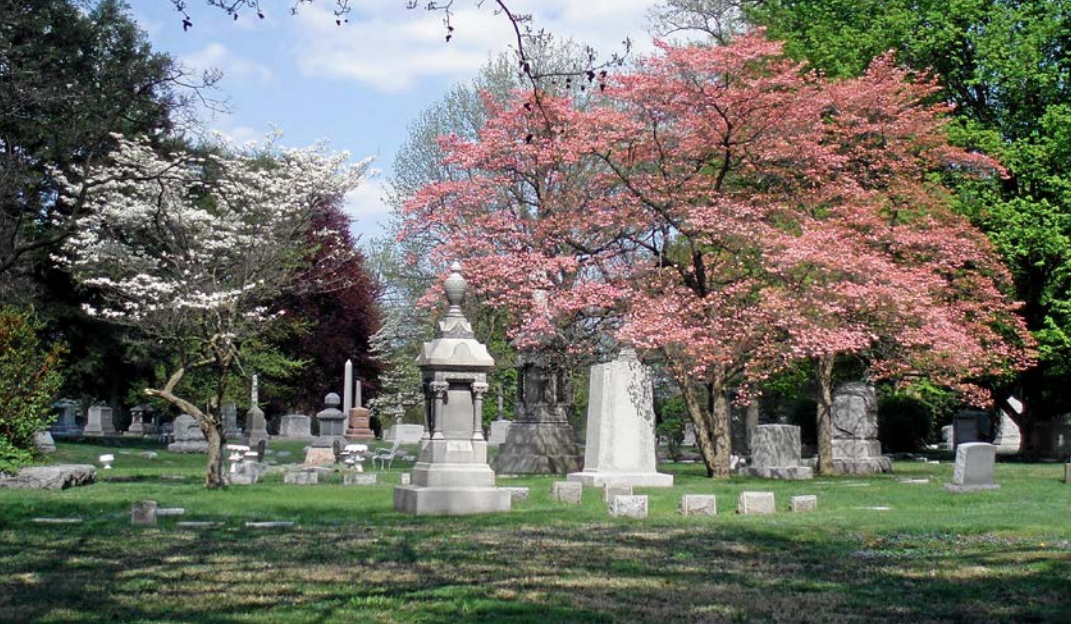

### A Haven for Natural Beauty

Over 2,000 trees representing over 100 spectacular species stretch skyward at Woodlawn. Thanks to the efforts of the cemetery's first superintendent, horticulturist Frank Eurich, (1876-1900), the 160 acre landscape boasts a rare roster of indigenous and exotic flora. This extensive tree canopy provides habitat for more than 208 confirmed varieties of birds.

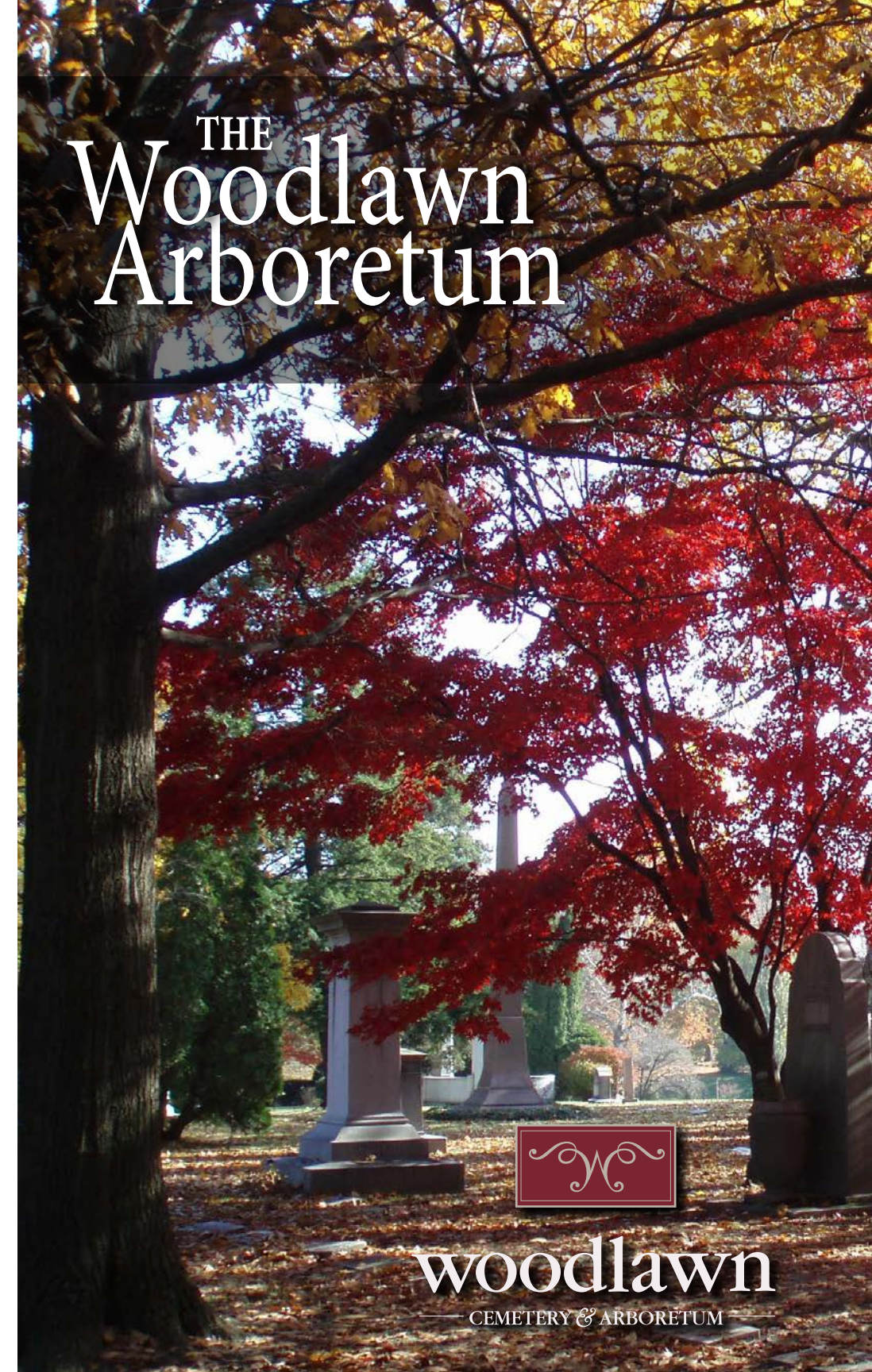
In the spring, the grounds of Woodlawn are in bloom with hundreds of flowering trees and shrubs - pinks, mauves, yellows and whites. In the fall, Woodlawn is a blanket of autumn's colors of red, gold, russet and yellow. Visitors are invited to walk the grounds to witness our spectacular arboretum first hand. An opportunity for a docent guided tree walk occurs each May and October during our Tree and Tombstone Tours.
